Trinidad High School is creating a community Green Space to support student Health & Wellness and College & Career Readiness. The Community Green Space project in Trinidad (Las Animas County) is a collaborative, community-based effort of Trinidad School District supported by partners Generation Schools Network, Colorado Parks & Wildlife, Trinidad Greenhouse, Trinidad State College and Trust for Public Land. The partnership is focused on creating a district GreenSpace where Trinidad students, families and the community can connect, increase food security and physical activity, reduce waste, manage wildlife and prepare for careers in horticulture, hydroponics and entrepreneurship.

HS Protecting Our Privacy

This unit will focus on protecting the privacy of students who are engaging in online activities. Students will learn how to distinguish between appropriate and inappropriate online disclosure, how to protect themselves from deceptive practices, and reasons to avoid sexting. They will also create a personal internet safety action plan. The unit will culminate in a project where students will write short stories, based on real-life events, about potential consequences of not practicing internet safety.



HS Healthy Habits

The lessons in this unit are designed to be inclusive of all races, ethnicities, body types, and income levels. Students will start by examining the assumptions that underlie most healthy-habits messaging. Then, they will go beyond a superficial lens and connect with a deeper "why" that informs their motivation for practicing healthy habits. After laying this fundamental groundwork, they will explore the topics of physical activity, healthy eating, and sleep.

MS Team Building (Spanish Translation)

The activities detailed in the lesson plans are great for building relationships at the beginning of the school year, reconnecting after a break, integrating a new student into the classroom, or repairing relationships when there is conflict. They can also be used regularly throughout the school year to challenge students to meet academic learning goals and build healthy classroom culture.

ES Time Management and Organization (Re-Release)

The goal of this unit is to provide students with the knowledge and practice they need to manage their time effectively. Students will discover the importance of time management, brainstorm barriers to effective organization, learn helpful tips, explore time management tools, and create a long-term plan.

HS Time Management and Organization (Re-Release)

This unit will teach students the importance of time management. They will take a closer look at how they use their time and be introduced to using a daily planner. Additionally students will learn how to develop an organizational style to help them learn how to make the best use of their time. The lessons culminate in a project where students will create their own planner design
