




Coal Train Capstone Launches in Trinidad School District



GSN supported Trinidad School District (TSD) in preparing for board adoption of its "Coal Train Capstone". In response to state requirements, the capstone was developed to provide an equitable and experiential learning activity for the graduating class of 2022. In Colorado, high school graduates must fulfill their district and the state's graduation requirements. The COVID-19 pandemic amplified learning loss for many students in TSD resulting in a need for additional learning opportunities to satisfy graduation requirements. The Colorado Department of Education allows school districts to design a capstone project that must be approved by the local school board. Dr. Bonnie Aaron (TSD Superintendent), Ashleigh Ackerman (TSD High School Counselor), and Elliot Zettas (GSN Sr. Manager) created and presented the capstone on July 2021 with a resounding 5-0 approval by the board. - MS *Protecting Our Privacy*: During this unit, students will focus on privacy protection, and learn how to distinguish between appropriate and inappropriate online disclosure, how to protect themselves from deceptive practices, and reasons to avoid sexting.
- ES *Effective Communication for Healthy Relationships*: This unit will provide elementary-aged students with foundational skills to build and sustain positive relationships with peers, adults, and family members. Students will develop communication skills, learn to differentiate between **positive and negative relationship** behaviors, explore **conflict** resolution strategies.
- HS *Healthy Relationships*: During this unit, students will explore five key practices of healthy relationships: self-compassion, empathy, trust, effective communication, and consent.
- ES Social Awareness: Introducing elementary school students to social awareness competencies, this unit will cover the following topics: social norms, empathy, understanding multiple perspectives, appreciation of differences, and support systems. The unit will culminate in a group project inviting students to collaborate with one another to express gratitude to a teacher or staff member.
- MS *Effective Communication for Healthy Relationships*: During this unit, students will work on effective communication, which is the ability to calmly and clearly communicate their message.
- HS Self-Awareness and Self-Regulation: By reflecting on personal experiences, values, and thought processes, students will develop the ability to analyze, synthesize, think critically, and achieve a positive sense of self. Such competencies are crucial for postsecondary successes.
- HS Collaboration and Teamwork: This unit offers students the opportunity to acquire and practice effective collaboration and teamwork skills.



• ES *Physical Activity*: In this unit, elementary students will explore not only the benefits of physical activity, but also learn to better and more easily incorporate it into their daily lives.
