

A Progression of Experiences for Professionals and Students

School Based

Professionals visit schools to share their own college and career pathway, teach a lesson, be an audience for student presentations and learn about students and their school.

Workplace Based

Students visit an office, tour the space, meet professionals, engage in job shadowing and learn about the world of work.

Workplace Learning

Students engage in learning, applying academic content and skills to real world situations, and learn the links between what they do in school and what professionals do in the 'real' world.

Peak Readiness Events

Professionals support students with specific needs 'just in time', for example, helping students revise personal statements before they write their college applications, or conducting mock interviews just before they start looking for summer jobs.

Mentorship & Internship

Professionals can build relationships with students over time as mentors, or by supporting internship opportunities. These relationships might extend beyond the visit, the school year or even high school.
