

This meeting brought together superintendents, principals, teachers, students, business members, and community members from Brush, Morgan County, Platte Valley, Weld RE3J, Weldon Valley, and Wiggins. The leaders met together to kick off the school year by choosing

their North Star skills. The goal of this meeting was to answer this overarching question: "What is the mismatch between skills students graduate with and skills local employers want?".

Through careful deliberation and discussion, participants were guided through a process and ultimately selected: communication, leadership, and integrity. Next steps will include facilitating a process with the help of Marzano Research to embed the skills into the pathway experiences, measure competency, and reflect progress on a community facing dashboard. The Front Range Equity Network (FREN) is a group of alternative and charter schools that serve students farthest from opportunity and work together to share college and career readiness programming. The schools and organizations in the FREN include: Arrupe Jesuit, Early College of Arvada, Hope Online, New America Schools (Thornton, Lakewood, and Aurora campuses), Prep Academy, RiseUp Community School, Turning Point of the City Westgate Community School and Zero Dropouts. ES Healthy Relationships

To increase the chances that each student will have at least one secure attachment (i.e. – healthy relationship/bond) with an adult in their life, this unit provides multiple opportunities for teachers to engage in classroom activities that strengthen relationships with their learners. The included lessons focus on sharing, expressing oneself, confidence-building, caring, and team-building activities. The unit culminates in a project designed to build trust.

HS Growth Mindset

By engaging in this unit, students will increase their understanding of the significance of a growth mindset, explore the malleability of the brain, brainstorm ways to nurture a growth mindset, and practice responding to both feedback and failure.

ES Mindfulness

Students will learn about mindfulness and its benefits. Throughout the five lessons, they will engage in a variety of mindfulness activities. The unit culminates in a project in which students will set a goal of doing at least one mindfulness activity daily for three weeks.
