MS Growth Mindset: As they engage in this unit, students will learn about the difference between fixed and growth mindsets, differentiate between learning goals and performance goals, understand the role of growth mindset in overcoming failure and adversity, and have the opportunity to engage in productive struggle. For their final project, they will write an essay sharing a personal story related to growth mindset. This unit is FREE through the end of August at our online store.



- ES *Mindfulness*: Students will learn about **mindfulness** and its benefits. Throughout the five lessons, they will engage in a variety of **mindfulness** activities. The unit culminates in a project in which students will set a goal of doing at least one **mindfulness** activity daily for three weeks. This unit is FREE in our online store.
- HS Service Learning: Students will begin this unit by exploring the concept of engaged citizenship. They will then be introduced to the idea of service learning. Using the website www.dosomething.org (a youth-led movement for good) as a jumping-off point, they will develop a service learning project that is framed by the question "Where do my interests, talents, and a community need meet?" In small groups, they will create detailed action plans for their project, which they will then implement. Their actual service learning projects will often take place during out-of-class time. Each group will create a video showcasing their project. The unit concludes with students reflecting on what they learned from their project. This unit is FREE through the end of August in our online store.

Three Schools Celebrate Major Accomplishments in Completion of the Turnaround Leadership Program



This spring, leadership teams from Hayden Valley Elementary School, Omar D. Blair Charter School, and Fisher's Peak Elementary School completed their 2.3-year Turnaround Leadership Program. These teams worked together with their Generation Schools Network coach to focus on building leadership capacity through a distributed leadership model, and on improving Student Performance. Despite the challenges of COVID-19, the

participants made significant improvements to their school systems. One participant noted:

"We are so thankful for all that we have learned while in this program. Each course has served to continuously improve our capacity as leaders and, thus,
